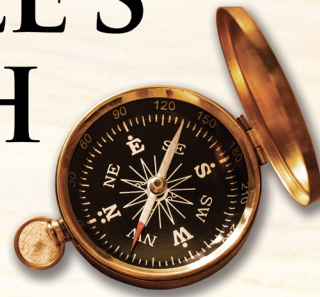

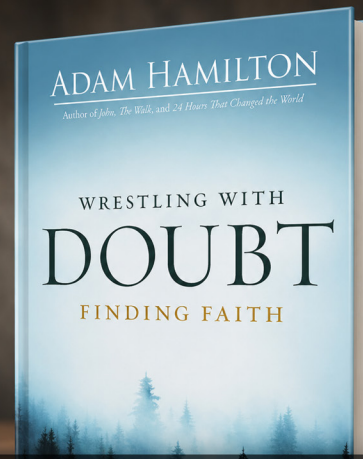

just trying to stay hydrated. But for four Wednesday nights this summer,  
we’re firing up Wesley Hall for *Casseroles & Curiosity*—because the
